MWA providing Macon-Bibb storm water consulting and management services

The Macon Water Authority (MWA) continues to provide storm water consulting and construction management services for Macon-Bibb County, extending a relationship that dates back to the days before consolidation of the city and county governments.

The funding facilitating this partnership between the Authority and Macon-Bibb County is the 2011 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax, or SPLOST, which voters passed in November of that year to fund a number of construction projects and improvements in the community. Of the total dollars expected to be raised over a six-year period since passage of the 2011 SPLOST, an estimated \$14 million has been earmarked for improvements to the storm water infrastructure in Macon-Bibb County.

Prior to consolidation, the MWA had entered into an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Macon to provide \$7 million worth – the City's half of the SPLOST appropriations – of consulting and construction management services for storm water projects. Under this agreement, the MWA has

served as the agent to manage and oversee the process of design, procurement, construction, and completion of SPLOST-funded storm water projects within the former city limits.

Since consolidation, the new Macon-Bibb County Government expanded the intergovernmental agreement with the MWA to encompass additional consulting services, which include the Authority's expertise in indentifying and recommending future improvements to the storm water system on behalf of Macon-Bibb County. The MWA now manages storm water projects funded by the 2011 voterapproved SPLOST throughout Macon-Bibb County, including the former unincorporated Bibb County.

To date, the storm water consulting and construction management services provided by the MWA for Macon-Bibb County have included the oversight of activities such as Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) to assess the condition of storm water infrastructure, as well as professional engineering to establish the repair methods for the specific projects. The engineering and construction process, which the Authority supervises for Macon-Bibb County, includes the management of reports, bid documents, specifications, and construction drawings for the designated SPLOST storm water projects, which are then advertised for bid to licensed utility contractors for construction. The MWA manages these storm water projects through to completion.

Amerson Plant to host Open House and 5K during Drinking Water Week

For more than 35 years, water utilities have been recognizing national Drinking Water Week during the first week in May. National Drinking Water Week is set for May 3-9, 2015, and the MWA has two major events on tap at its Frank C. Amerson, Jr. Water Treatment Plant to celebrate.

The first is the annual Open House on Thursday May 7, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Guests will be able to tour the campus of the water treatment facility, which has been selected as the Best Operated Plant in the state by the Georgia Association of Water Professionals on four occasions. provide an up-close look at how it produces award-winning drinking water, from the intakes at the Ocmulgee River and Javors Lucas Lake, to the treatment and filtration process, to finished drinking water storage, and more.

The Authority's Drinking Water Week celebration welcomes a new event this year - The Running Water 5K. In partnership with Mount de Sales Academy, the MWA will host this 5K at the Amerson Plant on Saturday May 9, to help area high schools raise money to purchase and install water bottle filling stations on their campuses. Mount de Sales has been leading the local initiative to "ban the bottle" and is encouraging other schools to do the same. A link to register for the Running Water 5K can be found on the MWA website.

Drinking Water Week is a unique opportunity for both water professionals and the communities they serve to recognize the vital role water plays in our everyday lives.

PAFR provides highlights of MWA financials and milestones in 2014

Macon Water Authority (MWA) customers are invited to review the current Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR), which provides easy-to-read highlights of the utility's fiscal performance this past year and financial condition to date.

The information included in both the CAFR and PAFR is compiled from the Authority's recently audited set of financial statements, which are prepared in accordance with generally accepted The independent auditors from Mauldin & Jenkins, CPA presented the annual Audit of the MWA and its subsidiary Macon Soils during the Authority's February Finance Committee Meeting. At that time, the auditors noted the Authority received a clean audit opinion, which means the financial statements of the MWA present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Authority for the fiscal year (FY) ending Sept. 30, 2014.

As a result, the MWA Board of Directors adopted the FY 2014 CAFR and Audit during its March Meeting, prior to the utility publishing the PAFR for the benefit of customers and other stakeholders.

The Authority's Pink Paradise float reflected the Cherry Blossom parade's theme of "Pink on Pink" and the Festival's overall purpose of "Love, Beauty, and International Friendship."

MWA employees decorated their Pink Paradise float with pink waves, in addition to palm trees accompanying hula girls in grass skirts and pink leis. It was only appropriate that the design of the MWA's float reflect a water paradise, since the utility provides finished drinking water for Macon-Bibb and surrounding counties.

The Cherry Blossom Festival has become one of the Top 20 Events in
