CAUSE OF MAJOR SPILL: The cause of this major spill was hydraulic overload due to heavy rains in the MWA service area as well as blockage due to debris. According to local rain data reports, between January 9th and January 12th, Macon-Bibb County received 4.40 inches of rain.

ESTIMATED VOLUME DISCHARGED: 349,800 gallons

Debris has been removed from the area. The affected area has also been sprayed with an enzyme treatment for organic waste called Bio-Bug.
