

ADDENDUM No. 2

ROCKY CREEK WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY PERIMETER FENCE INSTALL PROJECT

MACON, GEORGIA

This Addendum forms a part of the Contract Documents and modifies the original Specifications and Contract Documents as noted below.

ADDENDUM ITEMS:

- 1) Invitation to Bid: Delete the sentence “Fifty-one (51%) percent of the Work under the Contract Documents must be self-performed by the General Contractor.”
- 2) The definition of “DBE” as used in the contract documents is revised to be consistent with the language of the Interim Final Rule published by the U.S. Department of Transportation at 90 Federal Register 47969 (October 3, 2025).

Questions & Responses

1. Is a General Contractor’s license required to bid, or would this scope fall under a specialized trade classification?

Per O.C.G.A. § 43-41-17, the State of Georgia recognizes Fencing Contractors as a Traditional Specialty Contractor, allowing such Specialty Contractors to contract directly with an owner without being a licensed general contractor. Traditional Specialty Contractors will not be required to carry a General Contractor’s License. The Contractor must consult with a licensed electrician to ensure that all fences and gates within the transmission line corridor are properly grounded to protect against induced voltage.

The Bidder shall only submit the Contractor’s License Certification if applicable to them.

2. If this project is not federally funded is the federal DBE goal required?

The Owner has a self-imposed DBE goal of 10% and the Bidder is required to demonstrate their efforts to comply with this goal. This goal is not imposed to meet a condition due to federal funding.

With respect to the Contract Documents, “Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) compliance” refers to the Owner’s requirements that the Bidder demonstrate a “Good Faith Effort” has been made to achieve compliance with the Owner’s goal that a minimum of ten percent (10%) of the Contract Price shall be subcontracted to a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE). This is in pursuit of the Owner’s “desire...that local businesses--including disadvantaged, minority, and women enterprise subcontractors-- be given the opportunity to participate on the various parts of the Work” rather than a requirement dictated by specific legal regulations.

3. Is there a current DBE Directory in which to solicit DBE subcontractors' that is up to date per interim rule?
